Financial Aid

- 1. Students that need to do corrections on their financial aid application may do so at the MIS computer lab.
- 2. Pick up an attendance form if you are not adding or dropping any classes if all you classes are posted with no other changes, please see the financial aid office for an attendance form.
- 3. If you graduated high school after January 1, 2005, please be sure to turn in a high school transcript to the financial aid office.
- 4. The financial aid office will ONLY process financial aid for students that have the following:
 - a. Complete Financial Aid application
 - b. High School transcript (required only for students that have graduated after 1/1/05)
 - c. Copies of the following documents:

i.	High School diploma
ii.	Local ID
iii.	Birth Certificate and/or US Passport
iv.	Social Security Card

d. Attendance form (complete with signatures from instructors)

Financial Aid Office will be administering the Federal Work-study Program for the Spring 2010 semester for twelve (12) weeks. FAO is looking to hire 100 students (@ \$7.25 per hour). Each eligible FWS student may work up to 65 hours total and earn = \$471.25. Request forms, FWS policy forms and job description forms have been dropped off in the Deans/Directors/Supervisors inboxes in the Academic Affairs Office.

Please refer to our screening criteria for FWS students:

- 1) Check FWS application for scholarships (students receiving additional scholarships and grants are not eligible for FWS)
- 2) Must have a valid FAFSA application
 - Have answered Yes to FWS
 - All info. Provided:
 - ✓ Income
 - ✓ # of family members
 - √ Student/Parent signature
 - ✓ No default on loans
 - ✓ No EFC
- 3) FWS for Spring 2010 will be from February 8th, 2010 April 29, 2010
- 4) FWS Orientation dates:
 - Student orientation: February 3, 2010 (Falesamoa)
 - Supervisor orientation: February 4, 2010 (location to be announced)

- Must be interviewed by the GEAR UP Director



LSAMP Tutorial

The Buckley Amendment of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) Public Law 93-380

This amendment requires that institutions receiving Federal funds administered by the Department of Education must obtain the student's consent to release information from school records.

One exception to the law, however, is that information sought in connection with a student's application for receipt of financial aid is exempt. It has been determined that school records relating to VA benefits fall into the "financial aid" category and are therefore exempt from the provisions of the Buckley amendment.

Therefore, the VA (and SAA) shall have access to the records of VA beneficiaries as well as non-VA students without the written consent of the student in order to monitor the school's complicance with the law.
