Effective immediately, those enrolled in education benefit programs other than the Chapter 33 or Post 9/11 GI Bill, may verify their enrollment via the Web Automated Verification of Enrollment (WAVE) website, or by calling 1-800-823-2378. Those utilizing Chapter 35 (DEA) or Family members should call 1-800-827-1000 for verification. VA students attending under Chapter 33, or Post 9/11 are not required to verify enrollment. The ASCC Business Office will submit "invoices" for tuition to the VA before payments are processed and issued. Further questions should be referred to your VA representative and certifying official. Scholarship Opportunity

McDonald's American Samoa Scholarship Awards for 2014 – 2015 Academic Year:

• One \$8000 Scholarship Award to a qualified applicant who has completed the required courses for an AA degree at ASCC and is continuing his/her degree program at an accredited U.S. college/university.

Off-island Scholarship Award

To qualify for off –island awards, applicants must:

- Be a graduate of ASCC Class of Dec, 2013 and/or May, 2014
- Cumulative Grade Point Average of 3.5 or better
- Letter of Acceptance from an accredited US college/university
- Three letters of references
- Essay one page, double spaced, 12 font on why applicant should get the award
- Official copy of birth certificate or Photo ID
- Official transcript including Fall 2013 and final for Spring Semester 2014
- Parents/Guardian 2013 Tax Return
- Personal interview
- Recipients of ASG scholarship are ineligible for McDonald's scholarship

Scholarship Maintenance Requirements for ASCC and Off-island

Recipients are obligated to fulfill the following conditions to maintain award:

- Must be a full time student with a minimum of 12 credits towards degree program for two consecutive semesters (ELI courses do not count towards required 12 units per semester).
- Maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better
- Student is responsible for sending copy of official transcript to McDonald's. You must authorize your school and pay the necessary fee to mail your updated official transcript to: McDonald's, P.O. Box 577, Pago Pago, American Samoa 96799. McDonald's must receive the official transcript in a timely manner in order to facilitate and expedite the disbursement of second semester awards.
- Off-island recipients must declare major
- Non registration, early withdrawal, suspension/expulsion, or non attendance of classes will result in forfeiture of award

The application package consists of the following items and is available at McDonald's Head Office in Nuuuli beginning Feb 12, 2014, between 2pm and 4pm Mondays to Fridays. Make sure it is completed before turning it in. Incomplete packages will not be considered. **Deadline for turning applications is April 25, 2014 at McDonald's Head Office in Nuuuli at 4pm.**



crying girl, she exhales poison. she eats her salad... she feels everything.


she knows what you're thinking. she stutters, she makes mistakes and she laughs.
