

Also on the month of April You could store your trash away, For the 22nd day of this month, Is celebrated as our Earth Day.


Now you may be wondering, Why all this has to rhyme. But you see, April is Poetry month, And for that, I give you these lines.



Unlike other horror games that incorporate a "run and hide" type gameplay, FNAF3 is more similar to a tower defense game, having the player unable to move from his current position.


