Jonathan P. – "I would shoot them."




has a lot of heart...literally, and is a great "Twilight" substitute for date night.

Digital Hordes of the Living Dead: A Little Ditty on Zombie Videogames

For decades Zombies have been terrorizing books, home televisions, and of course the big screen with their undying hunger for human flesh. They have haunted generations of moviegoers and readers alike, taking us into decayed worlds filled with the living dead. Many movies and books have provided the scare, suspense and thrills that made you fear zombies, however, they never made you feel a part of the actual terror. That is until zombies dragged their rotten corps into the videogame world and gave you the power to control your fate. So instead of zombies preying on helpless victims, they are now preying on you.

The first time zombies came to life in videogame form was in the 1984 classic "Zombie Zombie," which was released on ZX Spectrum. "Zombie Zombie" drops players in the middle of a city overrun by the walking dead. Instead of using axes or shotguns to dismember zombie hordes, players knock enemies back with bursts of air from a rifle. "Zombie Zombie" used the basic concept that most zombie games would later follow... Survival.

But the rise of zombie videogames didn't come into full effect until 1996 when Sony PlayStation and Capcom Studios released Resident Evil. Game Director Shinji Mikami set out to create a game in Capcom's horror-themed RPG and inadvertently began a new generation of zombie storytelling. In Resident Evil, Raccoon City's STARS (Special Tactics and Rescue Service) investigates reports of cannibalism and the disappearance of Bravo Team. In the game, you are trapped in an old mansion infested with zombies and other monsters. As players explore this mysterious place, they uncover clues and solve puzzles. Depending on the player's actions, the game ends with different outcomes.

The Resident Evil franchise made zombie videogames a trend, and it would spark a generation of games that now dominate the videogame market, with games like Dead Rising (2006), Left 4 Dead (2008), Plants vs. Zombies (2009), Dead Space (2008), and The Last of Us (2013). Zombie videogames are getting more intense and a lot creepier, and in the true spirit of zombie lore some of these games are actually scary. Zombies have come along away since "Zombie Zombie," and this genre of storytelling isn't going anywhere anytime soon. And if zombie videogames start to die out...you can bet your assets that they'll be back and make the genre "un-dead" again... BoOyAh!




