Is it acceptable?

Under no circumstance is domestic violence is acceptable. Every situation may be different, with many factors involved. But one thing for sure: violence is never the answer. It is also important for victims to know is that there is help for them available, even here in American Samoa.

How can you help?

Report anything suspicious. If you think that someone is in danger, call 911 or file a report at a police station. It may help save a life.

Don't let yourself be a victim. Don't watch someone else be one too. Observe that October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month to educate and raise awareness to our friends, family and community here in American Samoa.


Bonus: you will find that all four of the original "Ghostbusters" make a cameo in the film.
